From the Vice-Chancellor's Desk......

Greetings to all.....

Agriculture continues to be a key driver of economic development, contributing 18.2% to the national GDP and demonstrating a robust annual growth rate of 5% between 2017 and 2023. This growth reflects the sector's resilience in the face of various challenges. With a view to accelerating agricultural growth and promoting rural prosperity, several new initiatives have been launched. One such initiative is the Prime Minister Dhan Dhanya Krishi Yojana-Developing Agricultural District Programme, implemented in partnership with state governments. In its first phase, the programme targets 100 districts



characterized by low productivity, moderate cropping intensity, and below-average credit access. It aims to foster comprehensive development through sustainable agriculture, improved access to institutional credit, conservation of natural resources, and reduction of post-harvest losses by developing storage infrastructure at the block and panchayat levels. The programme is expected to benefit approximately 1.7 crore farmers. Unemployment and rural-to-urban youth migration remain key obstacles to programme. To address these issues, Rural Prosperity and Resilience Programme has been introduced. It seeks to generate employment opportunities for rural youth, women, landless labourers, and marginal and small farmers by enhancing skills, stimulating investment, promoting demand-driven technologies, and strengthening the rural economy. India has made significant progress toward self-sufficiency in production of pulses with cultivated area expanding by over 50%. This is due to the central government's assurance of procurement at remunerative prices. Increased consumer incomes have also contributed to greater consumption of pulses. To further this advancement, the government has initiated a six-year mission focused on achieving selfreliance (Atmanirbhar Bharat) in the growth of pulses, particularly Tur, Urad, and Masur. Under this mission, all pulse growers are guaranteed procurement at fair prices through agencies such as NAFED and NCCF. Rising consumer awareness around nutrition and health has driven increased demand for fruits, vegetables, and millets (shreeanna). To support this shift, the government has introduced a comprehensive programme in collaboration with state governments, involving Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) and cooperatives to improve production and streamline supply chains. To promote climate-resilient agriculture, a National Mission on High-Yielding Seeds has been introduced. The mission focuses on developing and commercializing pest-resistant, climate-resilient, high-yielding seeds by strengthening the agricultural research ecosystem. Additionally, a five-year Cotton Productivity Mission has been introduced to enhance yields, sustain cotton farming, and promote extra-long staple cotton varieties. This mission is expected to benefit lakhs of cotton growers and ensure a reliable supply of quality cotton to support India's traditional textile sector. To address capital constraints in agriculture, the credit limit under the Kisan Credit Card scheme has been raised from ₹3 lakh to ₹5 lakh under a modified interest subvention scheme. This is expected to benefit 7.7 crore farmers, including fishermen and dairy farmers, by reducing dependence on informal lending sources. In pursuit of self-reliance in urea production, three dormant urea plants have been revived, and a new facility has been established in Assam. Furthermore, India Post is set to be transformed into a major public logistics organization, supporting artisans (Vishwakarmas), new entrepreneurs, self-help groups, MSMEs, and larger business entities. The budget reaffirms the critical role of agriculture in national development. It introduces new opportunities for farmers, entrepreneurs, women, and youth. This will pave way for laying the foundation for inclusive growth. The onus now lies with stakeholders to effectively leverage these initiatives for long-term benefits. aeno.

Zonal Research and Extension Workshop-2025





The Zonal Research and Extension Planning (ZREP) Workshop for 2025 was conducted at the Zonal Agricultural and Horticultural Research Station (ZAHRS), Brahmavar, from 13-03-2025 to 15-03-2025 and ZAHRS Shivamogga from 21-03-2025 to 22-03-2025. During the workshop, research proposals and extension activities for the year 2024-25 were reviewed and new proposals for the year 2025-26 were finalized.

Beekeeping Training Programmes under ICAR TSP Project

Under the ICAR Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) project titled "Empowering the Scheduled Tribes with Beekeeping Techniques in Shivamogga District of Karnataka," eight three-day beekeeping training programmes and a one-day awareness programme were conducted across various taluks of Shivamogga. These programmes collectively benefited 280 Scheduled Tribe (ST) participants. Additionally, eight exposure visits were organized, involving 240 beneficiaries, to enhance practical knowledge and field-level understanding. All trainees were provided with essential beekeeping



materials to support their initiation into the activity. As a positive outcome of the initiative, several participants have already adopted beekeeping as a subsidiary occupation, reflecting the programme's effectiveness in promoting sustainable rural livelihoods.

"Certification Course on Integrated Nutrient Management"

A certification course on Integrated Nutrient Management (INM) for input dealers of Primary Agricultural Co-operative Societies was conducted from January 6 to January 20, 2025. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. R. C. Jagadeesha, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, KSNUAHS, Shivamogga. In his inaugural address, Dr. Jagadeesha emphasized the importance of soil testing and advised input dealers to recommend fertilizers based on soil test results to promote sustainable nutrient management. The course provided comprehensive training on various approaches to INM.



Participants were also taken on field visits to observe successful enterprise integration on farmers' fields, vermi compost production units at Ramachandrapura Mutt, the Fertilizer Quality Control Laboratory and Biocontrol Laboratory at the District Agriculture Training Centre, Davanagere, and Taralabalu ICAR-KVK, Davanagere. A total of 25 input dealers benefited from the certification course, gaining practical and theoretical knowledge to enhance their service delivery in nutrient management.



Launching of Kisan Samriddhi Mobile App

The Areca Growers' Conclave, held on January 18, 2025 in Sagara Taluk of Shivamogga District, Karnataka, marked a landmark occasion in the history of Indian agriculture. During this event, the Hon'ble Minister of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare and Rural Development, Government of India, Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan, officially launched the Kisan Samriddhi Mobile App.

This mobile application, a key initiative under the Digital Vyapar Network, is aimed at empowering farmers, Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), and agri-entrepreneurs by serving as a



comprehensive digital platform. The app is designed to offer a one-stop solution by integrating services such as market access, input supply, financial assistance, and expert advisory support, thereby streamlining agricultural commerce and decision-making. The event witnessed the presence of prominent dignitaries, including Shri B. Y. Raghavendra, Member of Parliament, Shivamogga constituency; Shri Vishweshwara Hegde Kageri, Member of Parliament, Uttara Kannada constituency; District Minister Shri Madhu Bangarappa; MLA Shri Gopalakrishna Beluru; Dr. R.C. 
